Submission Requirements

All entrants must be current* Ohio ACEP members. The presenting author of the accepted abstract must attend the Ohio Emergency Medicine Residents' Assembly on August 9, 2018.

By submitting a poster to the All Ohio Emergency Medicine Resident's Assembly, you certify that:

- The poster is your original work or original work conducted by you and other authors, and all co-authors are appropriately credited for their contribution and have been informed of the submission. Infringements will result in disqualification from the Assembly.
- Any topics related to emergency medicine issues will be considered.
- No later than July 16, 2018, please submit your abstract to kshively@ohacep.org
- Please include a contact phone number and email address.

Abstract Criteria

List: Which category you are entering:

Resident Research / Medical Student Research / Resident Case Study / Medical Student Case Study

Length: Not to exceed 250 words; double-spaced. The 250-word limit only applies to the body of the abstract. Please keep in the mind, the judges will also receive your abstract prior to judging your poster.

Body: Must include purpose of research or the case and conclusion(s).

- Graphs and charts may be included; graphs and charts do not count toward and the abstract word limit.
- Your abstract can be about previously reported or current results. If your abstract has been previously accepted and/or presented at other conferences and/or published, please provide the relevant information (conference name, location, date, format, or journal name, volume, edition, date, page numbers). This information will not be considered as part of the 250-word limit.
- All costs associated with creation of the poster will be the responsibility of the entrants.

Poster Criteria

- Posters should fit within a 4' x 5' area. You may bring your Poster on printed paper. Ohio ACEP will supply a foam board, easel, and clips.
- You may hang your poster from 7– 7:30 am; these posters must be removed no later than 5:00 pm.
- You are encouraged to bring up to 10 photocopies (8.5" x 11" or 11" x 17") of your poster to distribute.
- Lettering and illustrations should be legible. Charts and illustrations should be similar to those used in slides.

Important Dates

- Abstracts will be accepted May 16 – July 16, 2018
- Presenters will be notified between July 17-20, 2018
- Judging and the announcement of both the "Research" and "Case Study" Resident and Medical Student winners of the cash prizes will occur at the All Ohio Emergency Medicine Residents' Assembly on August 9, 2018

2. INTRODUCTION

Give perspective emphasizing no more than 4 points:

Importance of problem

Previous Studies

Central Issue (questions, concerns, next move)

3. OBJECTIVES (Study Purpose)

Focused study question

Hypothesis

4. METHODS

Laboratory: Experimental model

Clinical: Study design, Participants, Inclusion/exclusion criteria

Experimental conditions and interventions

Outcome measurements

5. STATISTICAL METHODS

Sample size/power calculations

Analysis (i.e., T-test, ANOVA)

Significance (i.e., $p < .05$)

6. RESULTS (Graphs and charts preferred)

7. LIMITATIONS

Model and design

Data (numbers, variance)

Interpretation (translation to humans or other settings)

8. CONCLUSIONS (Up to 3 major points)

Clinical effects

Implications

9. FUTURE DIRECTIONS (optional)

Next steps

10. ACKNOWLEDGMENTS (optional)

Funding sources

2. INTRODUCTION

Give perspective emphasizing:

Importance of Case Study

Central Issue (questions, concerns, next move)

3. CASE DESCRIPTION

–History of Present Illness

–Family History

–Social History

–Physical Exam

–Labs, Radiology, Ultrasound, Studies (charts and images preferred)

4. CONCLUSION / DISCUSSION

Include background research if not widely known

5. KEY TAKE AWAY

Next steps or implications

6. ACKNOWLEDGMENTS (optional)

Funding sources

Technical help & Bibliography
