GREG HENRY, MD, FACEP

Dr. Gregory Henry is on staff at multiple hospitals in the Ann Arbor, Michigan area. He is the former Chief of the Dept of EM at Oakwood Hospital, a position he held for 21 years. Dr. Henry serves academically as Clinical Professor of the Dept of EM at the University of Michigan Medical School.

Dr. Henry is the past President of ACEP. One commentator recently called Greg Henry a "modern-day Socrates, Plato and Ben Franklin all rolled into one." ALEX ROSENAU, DO, FACEP. FACOEP

Dr. Alex Rosenau is nationally recognized as a leader in Emergency Medicine. He currently serves as President-Elect of ACEP and has served as Chair of ACOEP's EM Residency Program Directors' Committee and President of the

Pennsylvania Chapter, ACEP. He is one of five national advisors to the Society of Emergency Medicine Physician Assistants. In January, he assumed the chairmanship of the Emergency Medicine Foundation which has granted over \$9 million in research grants since its inception. In addition to his leadership and management activities, Dr. Rosenau is known as a mentor to many young physicians.



SHARI WELCH, MD, FACEP

Dr. Welch has been a practicing

emergency physician for 26 years and a quality improvement consultant for

10 years. Currently, Dr. Welch writes a regular column in *Emergency Medicine* News, which has a circulation of 40,000, titled Ouality Matters. She recently

co-authored a book for Health Administration Press on Patient Flow and her second book titled Quality Matters: Solutions for the Safe Emergency Department was published by Joint Commission Resources Publishing. Her third book on risk management for the emergency department is due to be released this summer.
