**Submission Requirements**

All entrants must be current\* Ohio ACEP members. The presenting author of the accepted abstract must attend the All Ohio Emergency Medicine Residents' Assembly on August 13, 2015 in Dublin, Ohio. Due to space, we must limit presenters to a 4' x 5' board.

**By submitting a poster to the All Ohio Emergency Medicine Resident's Assembly, you certify that:**

- The poster is your original work or original work conducted by you and other authors, and all co-authors are appropriately credited for their contribution and have been informed of the submission. Infringements will result in disqualification from the Assembly.
- Any topics related to emergency medicine issues will be considered. Please specify a category - Research or Case Study.
- No later than **July 24, 2015**, please submit your abstract to [kshively@ohacep.org](mailto:kshively@ohacep.org). Please include a contact phone number and email address.

**Abstract Criteria**

Length: Not to exceed 250 words; double-spaced (The 250-word limit does not include the list of authors and their respective institutions, nor does it include the title. The 250-word limit only applies to the body of the abstract.)

List: Authors and their respective institution(s).

Body: Must include purpose of research and brief overview on methods, results, and conclusion(s).

- No diagrams or tables should be included in the abstract. Do not include references.
- Your abstract can be about previously reported or current results. If your abstract has been previously accepted and/or presented at other conferences and/or published, please provide the relevant information (conference name, location, date, format, or journal name, volume, edition, date, page numbers). This information will not be considered as part of the 250-word limit.
- All costs associated with creation of the poster will be the responsibility of the entrants.

**Poster Criteria**

- You may hang your poster from 7:30 – 8:30 am; these posters must be removed no later than 5:00 pm.
- The poster boards are to be 4 ft high x 5 ft wide and participants must bring their own display easel.
- You are encouraged to bring up to 10 photocopies (8.5" x 11" or 11" x 17") of your poster to distribute.
- Organize the poster with: title, objectives, methods, statistical methods, results, limitations, and conclusions.
- Lettering and illustrations should be legible. Charts and illustrations should be similar to those used in slides.

**Important Dates**

- Abstracts will be accepted May 1, 2015 – **July 24, 2015**
- Presenters will be notified by July 15, 2015
- Judging and the announcement of the "Research" and "Case Study" winners of the \$250 cash prizes will occur at the All Ohio Emergency Medicine Residents' Assembly on August 13, 2015

Include author's names and institutions

**2. INTRODUCTION**

Give perspective emphasizing no more than 4 points:

Importance of problem

Previous Studies

Central Issue (questions, concerns, next move)

**3. OBJECTIVES (Study Purpose)**

Focused study question

Hypothesis

**4. METHODS**

Laboratory: Overall experimental model, Basic modeling system

Clinical: Study design, Participants, Inclusion/exclusion criteria

Experimental conditions and interventions

Outcome measurements

**5. STATISTICAL METHODS**

Sample size/power calculations

Analysis (i.e., T-test, ANOVA)

Significance (i.e.,  $p < .05$ )

**6. RESULTS (Graphs and charts preferred)**

**7. LIMITATIONS**

Model and design

Data (numbers, variance)

Interpretation (translation to humans or other settings)

**8. CONCLUSIONS (Up to 3 major points)**

**9. FUTURE DIRECTIONS (optional)**

Next steps

Clinical effects

Implications
